One of our most significant sources of revenue is the sales tax distribution from Ontario County, and while we have seen an increase this year that will help, we need to plan for a "normal" distribution next year, so we are not caught short. Shopping local and in Ontario County does have an impact—so please do so when you can.

We are happy to announce that we will have our **OPEN HOUSE** for our (not so) New Town Hall on October 15<sup>th</sup> from 9-11am. Please come and check out your new community facility.

nnual hunting licenses and privileges are valid from September 1 through August 31 each year.

Hunting and fishing licenses are available at the Town Clerk's Office. To obtain a hunting, bow hunting or trapping license, a previous hunting license or sportsman education certificate must be presented. To purchase a Resident license of any type, proof of residency is required. For information on Sportsman Education Courses being offered in your area, or to obtain a duplicate training certificate, you may call 1-888-HUNTED2.

REMINDER: New Deer and Bear Hunting Opportunities and Requirements Continue for 2022

- 1. Antlerless-only deer season in mid-September (9/10 9/18/2022) using firearms, crossbows, and vertical bows in WMUs 3M, 3R, 8A, 8F, 8G, 8J, 8N, 9A, and 9F, and using only vertical bows in WMUs 1C, 3S, 4J, and 8C. DMPs and DMAP tags only.
- 2. Daily hunting hours for deer and bear extended to 30 minutes before sunrise until 30 minutes after sunset.
- 3. Hunters must wear a <u>fluorescent orange or fluorescent pink hat or vest</u> when hunting deer or bear with a firearm.
- 4. Antlerless harvest allowed again during the early muzzleloader season in Northern Zone WMUs 6A, 6F, 6J.
- 5. Bear season in the Adirondacks is simplified by extending the regular season to cover the full hunting period.
- 6. 12- and 13-year-old hunters may hunt deer with a firearm or crossbow in counties that passed a local law to participate in the opportunity. See <u>Junior Big Game Hunting</u> (<u>www.dec.ny.gov</u>) for a map of participating counties.
- 7. Holiday Deer Hunt is an extension of the late bow and muzzleloader season from December 26 January 1 in the Southern Zone.

We've been inspired by our recent program presenters. Steve and Aaron Mumby shared some tips we all can use to record and preserve our elders' stories: A good quality smart phone with ample storage and extra battery is equal to expensive equipment. Make the subject comfortable (family member present, use audio if video is disturbing). Do not place the subject between the light and camera. Listen for distracting noises. Use a script and expand on it (chronological order is best). Ask open ended questions.

The Campbells demonstrated the painstaking work of cobblestone masonry, and Mike Borgeest showed us how "ghosting" on the walls outlines the original structure of a building. WBHS plans a project of its own in 2023 to further preserve our beautiful stained-glass windows.

We visited North Bloomfield Chapel in July and spent a great evening with the North Bloomfield Community Association. We aim to strengthen ties between our two groups in the year ahead.

For years we have been the stewards of "Welch Hall," a building the Town helped us acquire many years ago for \$100. The name of the hall pays homage to Dr. Mark Welch, who provided a sizable endowment to help our unit offer Scouting to any youth who wanted to be part of the Troop. Our leaders over the years have carefully kept the endowment intact and under close watch so that it remains in place for the benefit of our Scouting program. That, along with other fundraising efforts, has allowed our Troop to offer Scouting at no cost every year to young people and their families. That is right! FREE SCOUTING for any youth or parent who joins Troop 56. We hope to continue this practice for as long as we have youth who are interested in Scouting in the Town of West Bloomfield and in Ionia. That is why I continue to plead with community members to join our Troop and encourage your children to join us. We cannot continue without new Scouts and parents joining our ranks! Back to poor old Welch Hall, where the years have taken their toll. Our goal has been to move the hall from the wet area around the Highway Department to the West Bloomfield Fire Department property. The Department supports and charters our troop. Our concerns are: The building may not survive the move and renovations could exceed the cost of replacement. With fewer and fewer scouts each year we (the leaders) feel the funds may be better used for Scout activities and outings. We welcome your thoughts on this topic and the future of Scouting in West **Bloomfield**. It is not a problem we can fix with dollars; it is more a question of how to serve the Scouts we have. Our current situation with declining youth enrollment is one we have struggled with for years now. How do we get our youth and younger generation of parents interested in our Troop?

Troop and Pack 56 do make a difference. Who will organize and provide the "Scouting for Food" event to help fill our local food pantries each November? (This year the drive is on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>November 12</u>, and West Bloomfield Scouts will lead it in our town.)

As you read this, we are heading into the Fall season. It's always important to remind everyone to think safety when closing up our homes for the colder weather. Make sure you have had your heating system serviced and that all your smoke and CO detectors are in working order.

We have both smoke and CO detectors available if you don't have them and don't have the money to purchase your own. If you happen to still be burning wood, make sure your chimney or stove pipe has been cleaned.

Over the Summer, we have been busy training along with the West Bloomfield Fire Department. All our equipment has been inspected and serviced for the year. Each year much of our equipment must be inspected and tested including hose, ladders, air packs, hydraulic rescue tools, fire extinguishers and yes, even our trucks. This has all been completed. We had 2 controlled burns this Summer. One was a house on County Road 14 and the other was a large pile of debris in West Bloomfield. We responded to several incidents over the Summer including motor vehicle accidents, automatic alarms, trees and wires down, smoke/odor investigations and yes, even some small fires.

Our antique white pumper truck needs some major repairs and while some work was done by members during the late Winter and Spring, there is still much more to do. We are exploring options to get our pride and joy back to tip top shape before next Summer. This 1939 pumper was our very first pumper truck and we are anxious to get it repaired so we can again show it off around the community and perhaps attend some antique musters next Summer.

## **Millers Corners Cemetery**

It was a busy time around the cemetery this summer:

- Flags were placed by the veterans' graves and a brief ceremony was held on Memorial Day.
- A new, updated sign (pictured to the left) with the current Rules and Regulations for the cemetery was installed as required by the NYS Division of Cemeteries.
- Several trees were removed by 585TREE that were in danger of falling on memorial stones.
- The Town Highway Department cleaned up the brush and fallen tree limbs in front of the woods.
- The NYS Division of Cemeteries Investigator inspected the cemetery with the Superintendent and found everything in order.

Due to illness the company that performs the Interment duties notified us late of a significant price increase for their work. Our prices had to be adjusted and re-approved by the state. The revised prices are: plots - \$800, cremation burial - \$550; and casket burial \$900 with a \$300 surcharge if performed on a weekend or holiday.

**YOU CAN HELP:** Our maintenance funds are slowly dwindling. It would be appreciated if people would request in the obituary that donations be sent to the cemetery General Fund when a loved one passes. It would also be appreciated if a portion of your estate was donated to the General Fund when you pass and are being buried in the cemetery. As always, any donation would be accepted at any time from anyone.


